The testimony of Nathaniel Fairfield of Wenham testifieth & saith that I have Known a way that was formerly given by Mr Richard Dodge of Wenham to his Son William Dodge of said Wenham throw the said Richards Land to a piece of Land of about twenty aecrs given to the said William which twenty acers was apart of a track of Land Called the hundred acers & I this Deponant have----Known the said William & his Sons to improve said way for a bout Sixty years Last past through – a pasture called the Cow pasture as it now goweth (crossed through - & never had that any person pretended to stop said way) & so throu a gate that Leads out of said Cow pasture into the hundred acers So called which was the said Richards Land & To all the way from said gate to the said twenty acers & I never heard of any persons pretending to Stop said way til this time
